Coming Attractions — Workshop Updates



On Monday, April 8th, 2024, we welcome Kaari Meng Zabala, the owner of French General Workshop in Los Angeles. Kaari specializes in vintage notions from the south of France where she lived for a time

with her husband. French General also designs quilting fabrics and patterns for Moda which are available in quilt shops around the world.

Kaari will be teaching her "Botanical Heart" embroidery workshop. This class provides you with the opportunity to learn embroidery stitches which you can use to embellish your quilts. She will start with basic stitches and move on to advanced, so this class is appropriate for all skill levels.



The class will introduce a charming heart-shaped em-

broidery sampler which will be stitched on beautiful linen fabric which is $10^{\circ} \times 10^{\circ}$ square. It can be cut out and transformed into a lovely lavender sachet, or it could be framed for a wall hanging, or used as the center medallion of a quilt.

You need to purchase the kit to take the class. The kit is \$30 and includes everything you need: the printed sampler on linen, embroidery floss, needles, and snips. The only thing you need to bring is your embroidery hoop and any extra floss you might want to add to the sampler. If you're interested in making a sachet, French lavender will be available for purchase during the class at a cost of \$5 per cup.

This class will be held on Monday, at University Methodist Church in Irvine from 11am to 2pm. This is a 3-hour workshop. Kaari says this is about as long as most people can sit and stitch.

The cost of the class is 40, and the kit is 30.

On Sunday, June 9th, we present Barbara Blanton who is a true aficionado of applique, sometimes referred to as the "Dreaded 'A' Word". We are so honored to have this opportunity for Barbara to share her craft with us.

Barbara has an amazing sense of humor and is totally passionate about teaching applique. She loves to start with beginners and turning them into accomplished appliquers. Im-

agine how you can enhance your quilts with this new skill!

You may choose from two different projects to make: "Ascending" or "Lilly Rosenberry" in two color ways, red and green, or pink and lime green. Be sure to indicate your preference when you sign up for the class. Everything that you need to complete the block will be provided in the kit of

your choosing for \$20. Also, recommended notions will be accessible for use during the class and available for purchase at the guild meeting.

This workshop will be held at Orange Quilt Bee, 628 E, Katella Ave., Orange, CA 92867 from 10AM to 4PM.

The cost of the class is 40 and 20 for the kit.




