Goldsmith and Linda Jenkins. You may want to go on to complete the 13 wintery scenes combined with a pieced Irish Chain to make this beautiful quilt. This is a great way to get a head start on your Christmas quilting!

We will do this block in wool, but the quilt can be a combination of needle-turn applique and wool. It could make a beautiful wall hanging or a pillow. Lots of possibilities! Denise Helms has generously donated some wool to our guild. All participants are welcome to use this wool for their project to learn the technique taught in the class.

## It's All About the Inventory

New customers visiting our store for the first time often compliment us on our wonderful fabric selections. We are pretty proud of it and have come a long way from the mere 800 bolts on the shelves in 2009 when we opened the shop. Here is a little bit of information about fabric buying you might not know:

**Buying fabric should be really fun, right?** That's what we thought too. The truth is it's hard work, and it's not half as fun as hosting our favorite classes or seeing your smiling faces walk through our doors. It is, however, one of the most important parts

of our job. As shop owners, Pebble and I try to choose fabrics that reflect our taste and style of fabrics that we like and hope YOU like too -- that's the goal in retail. If we choose well, the fabric sells quickly and we get to buy more; if we miss the mark -- well, there's a sale rack for that!

**How often do we buy?** There is A LOT of fabric to choose from! Each of our vendors has four or more "releases" per year and each release will have multiple "collections" from which to choose.



Each collection may have as many as 40 prints offered in multiple colorways! Sometimes it can take three hours to look through the fabrics offered and make our selections. Our fabrics are scheduled to arrive each month and a spreadsheet of what's coming in helps to keep track of it all.

**How do we know what to pick?** There is no easy answer to this question -- maybe because it's pretty, it's fresh, it's new? Mostly we pick from collections we like best and think will appeal to our customers. Over the years, experience has taught us what to avoid - weird colors, excessively large prints, themed prints, etc. Sticking to a budget helps to keep our buying in check too!

#### It's All About the Inventory, Continued

How do we decide what to do with it? Some collections fly off the shelf, others need a little help with models and kits. OQB employees are the best at pulling fabrics and patterns and are always coming up with fun and unique ways to display the fabrics. Our goal is to create visuals that will inspire your creativity! And OQB certainly does a good job at that.

#### Can you reorder fabrics from a previous line?

The answer is almost always no. Fabric manufacturers will print to meet the orders placed by shops. By the time the collection has shipped to stores, most of the prints are sold out. An exception to this rule is blenders which are usually reorderable.

The price for this event is \$25 and includes dinner, entry to all of the activities shown below, as well as entry to the quilt show on Saturday. 
# "Quilts for All Seasons" Quilt Show "KICKOFF DINNER"

# Opportunity Quilt "My Enchanted Garden"






## **Show and Tell Quilts**

Happy hot summer to you. By the time you read this I hope the heat wave has passed, and you're sitting in the shade contemplating a new project.

As you know, each month we tell you about one of our organizations that the guild supports with your sewing. This month Julia Renaud has written an article to share information about where we donate the single-layer flannel blankets. Thanks, Julia!

## Featured 501 3c organization: Flannel Blankets go to South America and Mexico

We have been letting you know where your finished philanthropy items have been delivered to this year. This month I'd like to let you know where we deliver the single layer flannel blankets. These blankets are made with 1 yard of fabric, very simple to make but they bring lots of joy to the families that receive them. We were referred to Chelsie Ottesen who works with the many impoverished families in South America and Mexico that can use our blankets.

Chelsie delivered 60 blankets to Guatemala in March through the Naru, a 501 3c organization. "Naru is a non-profit organization in the highlands of Guatemala that brings nutritional recuperation, healthcare, and education to rural families suffering in extreme poverty and severe malnutrition."

In May, 35 blankets were delivered to orphanages and infant wards of hospitals in Mexico through Ninos sin Zapatos, a 501 3c organization. "This organization works with children and families living in poverty to provide necessities such as shoes, clothing, and essentials for children. Many live in temporary migrant communities without running water, electricity, or sewage systems."

Chelsie sent us a note: "Thank you and your organization guild for donating them! You gals are amazing! They bring such hope and love."

We'd love to see you at our next Sew Day on Wednesday, August 16th at Orange Quilt Bee. We start at 10 am and are packed up by 2 pm so we can return items to storage and take finished items to the chosen organizations. We can stay later to sew until the shop prepares for a class.

We will soon be sewing holiday placemats, as we need 250 by November. We'll provide an update on the total already received at the guild meeting. Making a placemat is a small project and quick to finish. Start with an orphan block or small focus print and sew until it's approximately 12" x 18". Quilt and bind and you're done.

All of the organizations are so grateful for all the items you sew for them. Thank you!

We now have rules for our Facebook Group. Here they are:


- Be Kind and Courteous
