



# Sunday, February 11, 2024 Workshop with Joanna Figueroa

Workshop: Plumeria

Where: Orange Quilt Bee, 626 E. Katella Ave. in Orange

Time: 10 am — 4 pm

Cost: \$40

To kick off the new year, we present Joanna Figueroa who will be teaching her newest pattern, "Plumeria."

"Plumeria" is a versatile pattern with two different size blocks and three pattern variations. You can make a large block from your favorite fat quarters, or a smaller block out of a Dessert Roll, as well as a two-color variation shown here in red and white. Or you could make a table runner, a small wall hanging, or a quilt.

#### Things you will learn:

- Sew and Flip Method and when to use it and why.
- Choosing fabrics and the various ways to go about that.

Kits will be available for the class if requested ahead of time. Joanna offers both the 2 -color red and white as well as multi-fabric spring one. The fabrics will not be the same as her sample because they will not be available until April, but they will be similar. The price of the kits has not been determined at this time. The pattern will be available in class for \$10 for those who do not purchase a kit.

Lori Maze made her second quilt, <u>Spools</u>, with the leftover 10" squares from her son's Double Wedding Ring quilt. It was a free pattern from Missouri Star Quilt Company.



Lori Maze made her <u>Double Wedding</u> <u>Ring</u> quilt using two layer cakes and the "Quiltsmart" fusible arcs. It is for her older son and his fiancée. There's no quilt label because they haven't set a date yet!



### **Show and Tell Quilts**



Mary Branca's quilt, <u>Christmas</u> <u>Figs</u>, was a Block of the Month project from Sew Crazed Quilt Store. She started it in 2017 and just finished it for her daughter, whether she wants it or not!

Jo Whitley's project was a <u>tote</u> with an unusual story. What began as a wool afghan got washed and shrank from 60" x 60" to 1 yd x 1 yd! It's lined and has pockets. There are still 3 ½ skeins of wool yarn left for free!





Tom Steven's quilt, <u>Goodnight Star</u> using Tim Holtz fabric, was foundation paper pieced. He did his own custom quilting, including feathering for the first time. He's not sure he'll ever do it again!

### **Show and Tell Quilts**



Bees 'n' Bloom is the first of Kathleen Quinn's UFOs to be completed for this year's challenge. She started it in 2015 while visiting her son in South Dakota. She saw the pattern at Sassycat Quilting Co. in Yankton, SD.

Kathleen's second completed UFO was <u>Raspberry Truffles</u>. She won it as a raffle basket prize at our 2019 Little Red Hen. It was 7 months of a BOM using French General fabrics.
