



#### Sunday, February 11, 2024, Workshop with Joanna Figueroa


Workshop: Plumeria Where: Orange Quilt Bee, 626 E. Katella Ave. in Orange Time: 10 am — 4 pm Cost: \$40

To kick off the new year, we present Joanna Figueroa of Fig Tree Quilts on Sunday, February 11, 2024. Joanna will be teaching her newest pattern "Plumeria." The block is interesting and unique, but simple enough to be made by a beginner. Believe it or not, there are only a few points to match in the center of the block. The rest is a simple stitch and flip method. Joanne will teach this method and when to use it.

The pattern gives you information on three different variations. The large block can be made from your favorite fat quarters. The slightly smaller block is made entirely from a dessert roll, and there is also a two-color version which was made in red and ivory.

Joann has made kits to order especially for our class. The multi-color is \$106.90, and the red and ivory is \$87.90. The pattern is included with the kit. For those who have signed up for the class, Joanna has sent you an email on ordering her kit. The kits are ready to go as soon as you place your order.

You must have a pattern to take the class. You can purchase a PDF version from Joanna's website for \$10.75. If you'd prefer a physical pattern, please let me know so I can request it from Joanna and you can pay me at the workshop. At this time, the class is full, but if you're interested, please sign up on the wait list.

On Monday, April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024, we welcome Kaari Meng Zabala of French General. She will be teaching her "Botanical Heart" embroidery workshop. This class is your opportunity to learn embroidery stitches using Kaari's embroidery pattern on natural linen fabric. She will start with basic stitches and move on to advanced, so this class is appropriate for all skill levels.

The class will introduce a charming heart-shaped embroidery sampler. It can be cut out and transformed into a lovely lavender sachet, or it could be framed or used as the center medallion of a quilt. The sampler is elegantly printed on quality linen which measures  $10^{\circ} \ge 10^{\circ}$ .

You must purchase the kit to take the class. The kit is \$30 and includes everything you need: the printed sampler, embroidery floss, needles, and snips. The only thing you need to bring is your embroidery hoop and any extra floss you might want to add to the sampler. Lavender will be sold at the class for \$5 a cup.

This is a 3-hour workshop. The cost of the class is \$40, and the kit is \$30. You may sign up at the guild meetings or contact Gail Larderuccio.




# Little Red Hen is Coming March 11, 2024

## **UFO Challenge Updates**

We now have 25 members participating in the UFO challenge! What is a UFO? UFO stands for "**U**n**f**inish **O**bjects." This means that you have purchased the pattern and the fabrics to get started but never got around to get it started. It's that partially completed top that you started at a class but haven't finished. It's a finished top that still needs to be quilted. It could even be that quilt that just needs binding and a label, but it's been sitting around awhile waiting for you to make them.

Here are the status reports for July and September for those UFO Challenge completed projects that have been checked in and been shown during Show & Tell or in the Quilt Show.

**November** – We have received 16 quilts with a total of 56,181 square inches completed and 152 tickets earned. For the month of October and November, we have the highest ever turned in UFOs! The winners were Michelle Howe (Moda Jelly Roll) and Gail Lauderuccio (Quilt Cup and Jelly Roll).

**Grand total to Date** – 33 quilts have been turned in with a total of 126,585 square inches completed and 334 tickets earned.

It is still not too late to sign up and get those UFOs out of your closets, drawers, boxes, or wherever you are hiding those UFOs, so get these projects done so you can cross them off your to-do list! Better late than never, right? We have two more turn in dates: February 2024 and last one, April 2024. Send me an email if you want to sign up before the February meeting!

## Applique + Piecing = New Possibilities with Sheila Frampton Cooper in 2 Sessions

San Francisco Quilters Guild has a few openings in a virtual workshop being taught by the fabulous **Sheila Frampton Cooper** coming up early this February. We would greatly appreciate it if you could you promote to your guild.

**Sheila Frampton Cooper** - Award winning (Houston, Paducah, etc.), and world renown, guilt artist... highly



sought after instructor ... cover girl for 'Simply Moderne' Magazine and more .... and her work has been displayed in the United States, France, England, Italy, China and Japan - Sheila is known for her bold, graphic, and colorful work.

Sheila will be teaching a two-session virtual workshop for our Guild this February 3 & 10. This gives you the great opportunity to work on your piece between sessions and receive valuable feedback.

Afraid of the 'A' word?.... Don't think 'A' is your cuppa... Well, this is not like any 'A' you have done before - In <u>Applique + Piecing = New Possibilities</u> you will learn to create your own original pattern and assemble the forms using a technique called Appli-piecing, originally developed by Carly Fallert-Gentry.

With this technique, you can bring almost any complex abstract or realistic idea into quilt form. You will retain a clean, graphic look and when complete, you will have a quilt top pieced together with a 1/4" seam allowance.
