On June 11th, we had a fabulous workshop with Anna Maria Horner who taught her beautiful "Folk Flower" quilt with machine stitched reverse applique. Her methods and creativity were truly inspiring. Many thanks to Anna Marie.

On **Monday, July 10, 2023**, we welcome our own Eileen Wintemute who will teach us how to paint on fabric, using a paintbrush and a mixture of all-purpose inks and aloe vera gel. The paint mixture has a consistency of oil paint, but the effect has the transparency of watercolor. The project will be to learn the techniques necessary to paint the hummingbird sipping nectar from a flower shown in the photograph. No drawing skills required. Eileen will show us how to transfer the picture onto your fabric. The finished project size is approximately 9" x 14".

#### It's All About the Inventory

New customers visiting our store for the first time often compliment us on our wonderful fabric selections. We are pretty proud of it and have come a long way from the mere 800 bolts on the shelves in 2009 when we opened the shop. Here is a little bit of information about fabric buying you might not know:

Buying fabric should be really fun, right? That's what we thought too. The truth is it's hard work, and it's not half as fun as hosting our favorite classes or seeing your smiling faces walk through our doors. It is, however, one of the most important parts of our job. As shop owners, Pebble and I try to choose fabrics that reflect our taste and style of fabrics that we like and hope YOU like too -- that's the goal in retail. If we choose well, the fabric sells quickly and we get to buy more; if we miss the mark -- well, there's a sale rack for that!

### **Featured Advertiser**

**How often do we buy?** There is A LOT of fabric to choose from! Each of our vendors has four or more "releases" per year and each release will have multiple "collections" from which to choose. Each collection may have as many as 40 prints offered in multiple colorways! Sometimes it can take three hours to look through the fabrics offered and make our selections. Our fabrics are scheduled to arrive each month and a spreadsheet of what's coming in helps to keep track of it all.

**How do we know what to pick?** There is no easy answer to this question -- maybe because it's pretty, it's fresh, it's new? Mostly we pick from collections we like best and think will appeal to our customers. Over the years, experience has taught us what to avoid - weird colors, excessively large prints, themed prints, etc. Sticking to a budget helps to keep our buying in check too!

**How do we decide what to do with it?** Some collections fly off the shelf, others need a little help with models and kits. OQB employees are the best at pulling fabrics and patterns and are always coming up with fun and unique ways to display the fabrics. Our goal is to create visuals that will inspire your creativity! And OQB certainly does a good job at that.

Can you reorder fabrics from a previous line? The answer is almost always no. Fabric manufacturers will print to meet the orders placed by shops. By the time the collection has shipped to stores, most of the prints are sold out. An exception to this rule is blenders which are usually reorderable.

That is just the tip of managing inventory! One thing we would like to convey is how much we appreciate our customers who have supported us through the years by purchasing directly from OQB. We are still in business because of you!

## 2023 Quilt Show News You Can Use

We have a completed layout for the show. We are happy to say we were able to accept all quilts and creative arts items that were entered. If you entered a quilt or item, you will receive an email soon with information about what happens next.

Bonnie Bennett and Sue Watkins will hand out bags and labels at the July guild meeting to all who had quilts accepted for the show. Please be sure you attend in July or designate a friend to pick up your bags.

<u>Important</u>: If you are submitting a quilt rolled on a pool noodle or other tube, you must make a bag for it that is long enough to encompass the quilt and the noodle completely. The bag must have a way to secure it closed at the top and your name must be on the bag itself. Call Bonnie or Sue for further information.

If you asked to have your quilts judged, don't forget to give Pam Hadfield a check for the judging fee, which is \$15 per quilt. You may pay for all of your judged entries with one check. Make the check out to Flying Geese Quilters Guild and either mail it to Pam's home (address is in the guild book) or give it to her at the July or August meeting.

Wristbands for the Friday night Quilt Show Kickoff Dinner are on sale through Mary Lu Booker. The price for this event is \$25 and includes dinner, entry to all of the Kickoff activities and the quilt show on Saturday. See the Quilt Show Kickoff and Dinner article elsewhere in this newsletter for the dinner menu and information about Friday evening's events.

Mary Lu also has regular "show only" wristbands for \$10 for those who are only working or attending the show on Saturday. Everyone must have a wristband to enter the show Saturday even if you are working that day (even Sue has to have one!) .

All of our members are asked to contribute by working to support our show, and there are lots of way to do that. We will especially need a big crew to hang the show on Friday starting at about 4:30. Ruth Honer will have signup sheets at the next three guild meetings so please go see her at the quilt show tables. She will show you what is available. We need you!!

### 2023 Quilt Show FAQs

#### Q. How do I turn in my quilts that were accepted for the show?

A. At the July guild meeting you will receive a plastic bag, labels to put on the bag, and an information sheet. You will put your quilt into the bag, label the bag as instructed, and bring the bag with your quilt in it to the August meeting. Give your bagged quilts to Bonnie Bennett or Sue Watkins. If you have more than one quilt, each quilt will have a separate bag.

# 2023 Quilt Show FAQs, Cont'd

#### Q. May I bring my quilt to turn in rolled on a foam roller or other tube?

A. Yes. You may use the provided plastic bag if the quilt and the roller are short enough to be completely enclosed in the plastic bag and the bag can be closed off at the top. Otherwise, you must make your own bag that is long enough to fully enclose the rolled-up quilt and the roller, and have a way of being fastened shut at the top. Your bag must have a label. The best way to label the bag is with a clear plastic pocket sewn onto the outside of the bag that is big enough for a 4.25x 5.5 card. Attach the label you were given in July to the card and put it in the pocket.

#### Q. What is the last thing I should do before putting my quilt into the entry bag?

A. It is good to use a lint roller to remove any loose threads or pet hair from your quilt. Make sure your label is complete and your sleeve is securely fastened to your quilt.

#### Q. When will I know if I won a prize for my quilt?

A. Ribbons will be attached to winning quilts after they are hung, and before the quilt show opens on Saturday morning. Ribbons will be included in the package when you get your quilt back after the show closes.

#### Q. When will I get my quilt back?

A. All quilts will be taken down following the end of our quilt show, placed in their bags, and prepared for returning them to their owners. Our target time for handing out the quilts to their owners is 5 p.m. This may vary depending on how long or short a time it takes to get the quilts down.

#### Q. What if I need my quilt sooner, may I take it down myself?

A. No, no one other than the takedown crew may be in the area when the quilts are being taken down. We would welcome your help taking down the quilts, but you will not get your quilt back until all the quilts are down and accounted for.


#### Q. I'm volunteering at the quilt show. Do I need to pay to enter?

A. Yes, everyone pays to enter. The money made at our show pays for our wonderful speakers throughout the year, our philanthropy work, our venue, our insurance, and other expenses.

#### Q. What if I have other questions?

# 2023 Quilt Show Acquisitions Information

#### July 10th Meeting:

We will be distributing an envelope for each quilt or Creative Arts item entered into the Quilt Show. The envelope will contain two labels, a white bag for your item, and directions for preparing your entry. Please plan to be at the meeting to pick up your envelope(s). If you cannot be there, please arrange for a friend to pick it up for you. This is very important!

#### August 14th Meeting:

We will be collecting your show submissions in the white bags.

However, if you are submitting a quilt on a pool noodle, and the noodle is too long for our white bag, you must make a bag for it. (See photo of sample noodle bag as compared to our provided white bag.) The bag must be long enough to cover both the length of the noodle and quilt. Please trim the noodle so that it is only an inch or two longer than the quilt on either end. The bag must also be secured at the top in some way. (Note the ribbon ties sewn into the bag seam in the sample.) Also make a vinyl pocket on the bag to hold a 4.25" x 5.5" label. Your name should be on your noodle as well.


