UFO Challenge Update

We currently have 22 members participating in the UFO challenge! What is a UFO? UFO stands for **Unf**inished **O**bjects. This means that: you have purchased the pattern and the fabrics to get started, but you never got around to starting it; it's that partially completed top that you started at a class but haven't finished; it's a finished top that still needs to be quilted; or it could even be that quilt that just needs binding and a label, but it's been sitting around awhile waiting for you to make them.

Here are the status reports for July and September for those UFO Challenge "completed" projects that have been checked in, participated in the Show & Tell, and/or shown in the Quilt Show:

- **July** We received 9 quilts with a total of 37,151 square inches completed and earned 97 tickets. The winners were Ruth Honer and Kathy Hartman.
- **September** We received 8 quilts with a total of 33,253 square inches completed and earned 85 tickets. The winners were Kathy Hartman and Jeanne Stone.
- **Grand total** 17 quilts were turned in with a total of 70,404 square inches completed and 182 tickets were earned.

It is still not too late to late sign up and get those UFOs out of your closets, drawers, boxes, or wherever you are hiding them. Get these projects done so you can cross them off your "to do" list! Better late than never, right?

Tom's Stevens quilt, <u>Moonlight</u>, won 2nd Place at the Orange County Fair this past summer. He pieced and longarm quilted it himself. He's only been quilting for one and a half years—beautiful work!





Jo Whitley used machine embroidery and over 48 colors of Isacord embroidery thread to make her quilt version of Thomas Kincaid's painting, <u>Everett's Cottage</u>. She combined 5 panels in order to recreate the painting.





A Quilt with a Story to Tell...

Flying Geese Quilt Guild recently received an email from an author, Dr. Ted M. Moore, who is interested in sharing his first novel with us, which was inspired by a hope quilt his mother made for his father. The following is a brief overview of the book's origin, followed by a short synopsis, in the author's own words.



"I am writing to see if my new novel *Scraps* would be of interest to members of your quilt guild. It was inspired by a hope quilt my mother made for my father while he was flying 32 missions in a B-17 bomber over Nazi Germany during WWII. She was pregnant with me at the time. It is now available in print on BookBaby Bookshop, Barnes & Noble, or Amazon (slower delivery), or can be instantly downloaded as an e-book. It is a work of fiction suitable for anyone except children due to some violence but no bad words or explicit sexual content. I do think it is a good read and somewhat unique with a quilt as the connecting link. I have attached a short summary and picture of the cover which is my dad's quilt. Thanks for your consideration."

SCRAPS

"Jake Conner has spent the last three years fighting a war he never really believed in. As he returns to his Arkansas home – his best friend in a makeshift coffin – he wants nothing more than a life removed from the senselessness of war. Fruitful days on his farm with his sons Steven and Glen. Peaceful nights with his wife Sue beneath the quilt she made for him in the hope he would indeed one day return.

"But life is neither its happiest moments nor its darkest days. It is a tapestry of scraps, like the quilt itself. And in the years that follow, the owners of that quilt will see life in all its fullness, for better or worse. It will shelter Steven in his final hours. It will comfort an adopted daughter in the aftermath of unspeakable tragedy.

"From parent to child, generation to generation, Scraps will witness joy and sorrow, good and evil, and the people who experience it all. It will journey with Glen and Lucy from the remote soil of Arkansas to the burgeoning city of Dallas. It will accompany Rachel and experience wealth and society in Boston. It will travel with Mary and Jeremiah to Chicago and encounter violence and bloodshed.

"And when it's needed most, it will find its way home once more to Sue, to say goodbye, before returning north again with her great granddaughter.

"*Scraps* is a journey of love, loss, and family spanning the years from the end of the Civil War through WWII."
