get those creative juices flowing!




Coming Attractions — Workshop Updates

The class will take place at Orange Quilt Bee from 10 am to 4 pm. The cost of the class is \$45.




<u>Currently, the class is full.</u> But please get on the wait list. Frequently, everyone on the wait list gets into the class.




Zoom

Holly made her quilt, <u>Modern HSTs</u>, from scraps sorted by value and then sewn into HSTs. It is her original design created on EQ8. It's a UFO begun in 2019 and finished in 2024.

Joanne's <u>Sorbet Sunset</u> quilt is a paper-pieced pattern by Veruschka Zarate of Pride & Joy Quilting. She used a fabric bundle designed by Jennifer Sampou. The pattern description "beginner friendly" inspired her to take on this project.
