Engineer Your Quilts-March 10, 2025

In March, we welcome modern quilter **Karen Bolan**. She is drawn to the layers of design and expression possible in quilting and loves the learning that comes from experimenting. Her designs are out of the box, and integrate a love of geometry, experimentation, interconnection, depth, and texture.

Her work has been featured in magazines and exhibited at local and international quilt shows.

She will show us how to free ourselves from the need to use someone else's pattern and appoint each of us head of own design empire.

We will see a gallery of original quilts and learn how to apply the engineering design process to your quilts. We will learn to find and use sources of inspiration, harness nifty software and manual tools, and get inspired by approachable improvisational techniques



Quilt Labels to Love—April 14, 2025

David Owen Hastings is a graphic designer and quilter. In this live stream Zoom lecture, he will show us how to combine computer-printed custom labels with a woven logo label on our quilts, providing them with a professional finish, and documenting important details for posterity (or for the recipient).

Quilts are a wonderful art form, and he feels you should sign your work with a distinctive label. It's a great opportunity for you to consistently brand your quilts, especially those you gift to others on holidays or other special occasions.

It's also an opportunity to weave in the story of your quilt, so the story doesn't get lost. Was the quilt made for a special occasion? Was it made from a pattern, based on tradition, or is it a unique design? Who were the makers, and where was it made? Are there special fabrics used that require particular care? Imagine someone seeing your creation in the future: what would you want them to know?

David will walk participants through the steps to create these beautiful labels and will share alternate labeling methods that draw from his graphic design background.

In David's live stream Zoom lecture he will share a template with us for making simple and stylish labels for our quilts, as well as links to the materials and suppliers he recommends. The template includes his top tips for producing beautiful quilt labels.

Coming Attractions — Workshop Updates

February 9, 2025—Cyndi McChesney

On Sunday, February 9th, 2025, we present **Cyndi McChesney** who will teach us how to enhance printed fabric panels with her class entitled "Panel Palooza." In this workshop, quilters will take that panel they fell in love with and turn it into something truly unique. Cyndi will discuss how to square up your panel and add interesting block treatments and borders. She will cover the basics of graphing, adding coping strips and more, all guaranteed to make your panel project a success.

Cyndi's book, <u>Fun With Panels</u>, is required for the class, so please order yours on-line ahead of time.

The class will take place at Orange Quilt Bee from 10 am to 4 pm. The cost of the class is \$45.



<u>Currently, the class is full.</u> But please get on the wait list if you're interested. And if you don't get into the class, Cyndi's book is full of wonderful ideas to create your panel quilt on your own.

March 9, 2025—Karen Bolan

On Sunday, March 9th, 2025, we welcome modern quilter **Karen Bolan** whose workshop is entitled "Design an Original Modern Quilt." For all of our creative quilters, this is your chance to shine. Have you ever seen a photo, drawing or piece of artwork and wondered, "How can I make that into a quilt?" Then this class is for you!

This is a technique workshop that can be used for modern, as well as traditional quilts which will elevate your quilting skill level. It will be one more tool in your toolbox so you can create your own interpretation of an image.

Karen's quilt is an example of what you can create. You will turn your own original design into a mini quilt by drafting your own foundation paper piecing pattern. Karen's method uses freezer paper instead of the traditional foundation paper piecing which makes easier for construction. You will also learn tricks for efficient use of fabric.



The class will be held at Orange Quilt Bee and costs \$40. **This class is almost full**, so be sure to sign up at the next guild meeting.

There is no workshop in April.



Each month I wait for a bit of a writing thunderbolt to strike me, so I'll know what to write in this article. So, as I sat here waiting for an idea, I was thinking of everything in the news - here in CA, in the USA, and in the world. Wow - so much has happened in just two weeks of 2025. I was reminded of driving along a street and then encountered a rotary (roundabout or traffic circle). You need to know where you're going so you drive in the correct direction.

A rotary is just an intersection without a traffic light. You can go right, straight, or left - you just need to keep driving without stopping. Of course, the three rotaries near me in Irvine are in residential areas so no one is speeding through them - quite different than some rotaries I've driven through in other cities. Plus there's usually something pretty in the middle of the rotary circle - in one there's a beautiful Jacaranda tree with large purple blossoms every Spring.


