Program Feature - Next Meeting

On June 9th, we are excited to welcome award-winning quilter, Nancy Prince.







Nancy is an award-winning quilt artist from Orlando, Florida, <u>specializing in thread painting</u>. Her "anyone-can-do-it approach" to thread painting is fun, easy, and a new way for quilters to broaden their quilting experience.

Nancy's quilts have won numerous awards, the most prestigious being the 2014 Best of Show at the International Quilt Festival in Houston, the 2015 Best of World at Mancuso's Quilt World in New England, and the Marie White Masterpiece award at Road to California. Her quilts have also won 9 Best of Show awards, and 20 Viewer's Choice awards. Nancy is the author of two books: Simple Thread Painting and Thread Painting with Style. She has taped episodes for "Simply Quilts" and "The Quilt Show" with Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims and has appeared in national magazines.

Nancy is addicted to thread painting and her enthusiasm in workshops can be contagious!!! Students comment on her commitment to one-on-one attention and her upbeat attitude. She travels the country teaching and lecturing to anyone who will listen to share the excitement and creativity thread painting brings to her quilting world. She excels in taking the mystique out of thread painting, making it easy for anyone to master.

Coming Attractions—Program Updates

July 14th - Kathy McNeil

In July, we will welcome Kathy McNeil via Zoom. Kathy has retired from lecturing in person, and we feel so fortunate to be able to hear her live via Zoom.

Kathy McNeil is an internationally award-winning quilt artist, author, pattern designer, art quilter, and judge.

By hand appliqueing scraps of fabric together, she creates quilts that look like paintings. Often using over a hundred different fabrics in one composition, she revels in adding small details and surprises for the viewer to find. The quilting itself adds an extra element of texture to her work. Her quilts are often featured in museums, magazines, calendars, and international shows. Many of her quilts are in private collections.

Sandra is an award-winning Quilter who is best known for her technique "material matrix." She will be sharing a trunk show with us and also offering a two-day workshop.

Coming Attractions—Workshop Updates

Nancy Prince – June 8 Thread Painting Workshop



Our next workshop will be "Thread Painting" with Nancy Prince on June 8, 2025. Our project has been changed from "Woodlands" to a beautiful red "Flower" design.

This workshop offers a hands-on introduction to free-motion machine embroidery. With Nancy's "anyone-can-do-it" approach, participants will learn how to use

their sewing machine and thread to "paint" or embellish their quilt. A printed photograph will be supplied to boost your confidence in creating this project.



<u>A kit is required</u> for this class which costs \$16. This includes custom-printed background fabric, 3 pieces of stabilizer, instruction booklet and practice products. A 6" machine embroidery hoop is also required. If you need this, you can order it for an additional \$11.50 when you sign up.

The cost is \$40 for the workshop and \$16 for the required kit for a total of \$56. If you also want the optional machine embroidery hoop for \$11.50, the total is \$67.50. If you have already paid the higher price, we will refund you \$3 at the workshop.

The workshop will be held at Orange Quilt Bee from 10am to 4pm.

July 13 – Bag-Making Workshop with Yvonne Webb

On July 13th, 2025, we are offering a fun "Bag-Making" workshop with our own member **Yvonne Webb**. Have you ever wanted to try your hand at bag-making but felt unsure of your skills? Then this workshop is for you!



The project Yvonne has chosen is called "Stash and Dash," a "By Annie" pattern for a fold-over organizer bag. In this workshop, you will learn how to use Soft and Stable, attach zippers to mesh, make a zippered pocket, cover strapping with fabric, work with vinyl and tips for making professional-looking binding.


After mastering the skills in this workshop, you will have the confidence to make any other By Annie bag or project.

Required for the class is the "Stash and Dash" pattern which is available at Orange Quilt Bee or online at By Annie or Amazon. Orange Quilt Bee carries the supplies required for this organizer. Yvonne will supply the vinyl as we only need a small piece.

In this workshop you will learn so much and end up with a handy bag that can be used to organize sewing supplies, first aid supplies, car necessities and more.

The workshop will be held at Orange Quilt Bee, 628 E. Katella Ave., Orange, CA 92867 from 10am to 4pm.

The cost is \$40 for the workshop.

August 10-11 Material Matrix With Sandra Bruce

In August, we have a special opportunity to take a <u>two-day workshop</u> with **Sandra Bruce** on Sunday, August 10th and Monday, August 11th, 2025. Sandra will be teaching her specialty, "Material Matrix," which she developed after being inspired by painter, Chuck Close.



This method involves using a gridded photograph as the foundation for a unique fabric interpretation into an art quilt. Each 2" square of the photo is reimagined in fabric, through detailed piecing, resulting in a striking mosaic-like image.

Sandra's project for us is her new "Pepper Pelican" design. Everyone in the class will work on this project. You will be provided with a template and handout so the piecing can be finished at home with confidence.

In this workshop Sandra will also teach what makes for a good photo to use, color and value, curved piecing and how to grid your own photo.



The class will begin on Sunday, August 10th and will be held at Orange Quilt Bee, 628 E. Katella Ave., Orange, CA 92867 from 10am to 4pm.



It will continue on Monday, August 11th at University United Methodist Church, 18422 Culver Dr., Irvine CA 92612 from 10am to 4pm.



The cost of the two-day class is \$80.



Have you bought your Opportunity Quilt tickets yet?


If you can't make it to the guild meeting, contact Mary Lu Booker and she will fill out the tickets for you.

It is an easy form to complete, and we encourage everyone to participate!





Applications are due by July 14. We need a separate application for each item you are entering. If you start a form and want to return later to finish it, click on SAVE at the bottom and you will be directed to enter your email to access the form link. It is also OK to just start over with a new form. Just email Ellen and let her know you might have a duplicate; it is easy to fix.



We need measurements and an item photo no later than July 14. The purpose of the photo is to help us layout the show. Photos are not published anywhere. At minimum, the photo should show the pattern and the fabric you are using. Photos can also be emailed to Ellen Reibling at applications@flying-geese.org or text – refer to the directory for contact information.



The form is "smart" in that some information is not visible until you click on certain categories. The most common one is for judged quilts. You will not see the judging categories unless you click on "I want my quilt judged," and in the same vein if you unclick the judged box the categories will disappear.



Completed quilts are due by either **September 20** for judged quilts or **October 10** for everything else.







UFO Challenge

UFO Challenge is Back!

Now that the Quilt challenge is over, here's an opportunity for you to finish up on your fabulous quilts that you have been putting off, so you can put them in the next Quilt Show. (UFO stands for Unfinished Objects or Unfinished Projects. It can also be your PHDs which stands for Projects Half-Done.)

The UFO challenge officially started last month on May 13th!


- You can join any time after this date. Look for the sign-up sheets at the next Guild meeting on June 9th to take home and you can list from one to five projects that you would like to finish throughout the year. You can choose how many you would like to submit and which month they will be due.
- Your projects must have been started prior to December 2024 and must be a minimum of 200 square inches (example 10" x 20"), quilted, with binding, labeled, and sleeved. Bring back this form and a \$10 fee at the next June meeting to start on your journey in getting these quilt projects done.
- The <u>due dates</u> for the UFOs are July 2025, September 2025, November 2025, February 2026, and April 2026. You can still turn them in, even if you are late to be eligible for all the prizes!!



There will be prizes! Raffle tickets will be issued on a point system based on timely submission, number of square inches, and all other components such as binding, sleeve, and labels.

It could even be that quilt that just needs binding and a label, but it's been sitting around a while waiting for you to make them. Must have been started prior to December 2024 and a minimum of 200 square inches (Example 20in x 10in.) Whatever the case, let's dust off those older projects and complete some UFOs. You could even win a prize for doing so!

We want this to be fun and doable for everyone so here's how it's going to work. You choose from one to five UFOs you'd like to complete by April 2026. You tell me which month on which quilt will be done. A completed UFO is quilted and bound. We would really like to see labels and hanging sleeves as well, but for this challenge it's not necessary. You sign up below and pay a \$10 entry fee (no matter how many quilts you submit). You will get a ribbon to get started and will earn a special pin for each quilt turned in.

There will be a drawing each month a UFO is due among those who turn for that assigned month. There will be a special drawing for a "Grand Prize" for those who completed all five quilts on time! Additionally, tickets will be awarded for random drawings throughout our challenge period. Tickets are earned as follows:

- 1 Ticket for each UFO turned in (up to 5)
- 5 Tickets for turning in your UFO on time or earlier
- 3 Tickets for turning in your UFO late
- 1 Ticket if UFO has label
- 1 Ticket if UFO has a hanging sleeve

- 5 Tickets if UFO is older than 2008
- 4 Tickets if UFO is older than 2012
- 3 Tickets if UFO is older than 2016
- 2 Tickets if UFO is older than 2020
- 1 Tickets if UFO is older than 2024

Quilt Sizes:

- 1 Ticket Smaller than a Baby Quilt 2,475 sq in or under
- 2 Tickets Baby/Crib/Lap 45" x 55" = 2,475 sq in and higher
- 3 Tickets Afghan/Throw 55" x 65" = 3,575 sq in and higher
- 4 Tickets Twin 70" x 90" sq in = 6,300 and higher
- 5 Tickets Double, Queen, and King 80" x 90" = 7,200 sq in and higher


